Membership outline, activities and benefits

Chapter Membership

Provisional Membership is available initially – it's free!
Chapter Membership is the ongoing category for all members.

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Try before you buy!

As a **Provisional Member**, you are invited to attend main monthly rides and monthly meetings.

This is to ensure that you want to be part of Sunshine Coast H.O.G. After all, Chapter membership does come at a price.

An application for membership may be lodged after completing two Main Rides and attending one Meeting.

There is a maximum attendance at three main monthly rides and meetings after which you must apply for Membership to continue to attend Chapter events.

Provisional membership may only be awarded once in a twelve month period.

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Members may invite a friend or another Harley or Buell owner on a ride or to a meeting. Members are responsible for the behaviour and actions of their guest. (Harleys and Buells only on Chapter rides).

Each guest must be introduced to the Membership Officer, Head Road Captain and Safety Officer prior to the ride or to the Membership Officer or LOH Officer before the meeting. Each guest is limited to attending three rides and three meetings in any twelve month period. Often guests choose to apply for membership.

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Rides

There is a set ride on the 3rd Sunday of each month – the “Main Ride”.

Annual “Give me 5 for Kids” Charity Ride.

State and National Rallies – 3 or so a year.

Plus other organised events such as “Overnighters” + Breakfast – Dinner Poker Rides Weekend Trips Rider Training and more. Usually one of these events or something similar happens each month with a couple of months’ notice.

Finances

The Chapter is sponsored by Sunshine Coast Harley-Davidson and other funding comes from ride register fees, membership fees, raffles and paid advertisements in the Newsletter. Also from time to time by hosting Bunnings BBQ’s and providing the Ironman Association with their Official’s ‘Motos’ for their cycling events.

The Chapter owns a twelve-seater minibus back-up vehicle and Sunshine Coast Harley Davidson generously provides a back-up trailer for main monthly rides.

Surplus funds are used to subsidise members’ activities.

Meetings

There is a monthly members' meeting held at the Waterfront Hotel 2/46 David Low Way, Diddillibah, Maroochydore. Events and items of interest are advised and members' views invited. This (mostly social) meeting is currently held on the Wednesday prior to the Main Ride and commences at 7pm.

Pre-meeting quality meals are available to our members and their guests. You are most welcome to share a little fellowship with members before and after the meeting which is usually over in an hour.

The Chapter's Working Committee resolves most routine issues at their monthly meeting.

Newsletter

The Chapter's Magazine is a top quality production full of interesting bike-oriented news. It's distributed at the Main Ride and Chapter meeting and at the Dealership. A colour version is on the Chapter website.

For members there is a great range of H.O.G. Chapter specific Regalia, T-Shirts, Pins, Patches and Novelties available.

- The policy of H.O.G. is that products are for use of H.O.G. Members only.

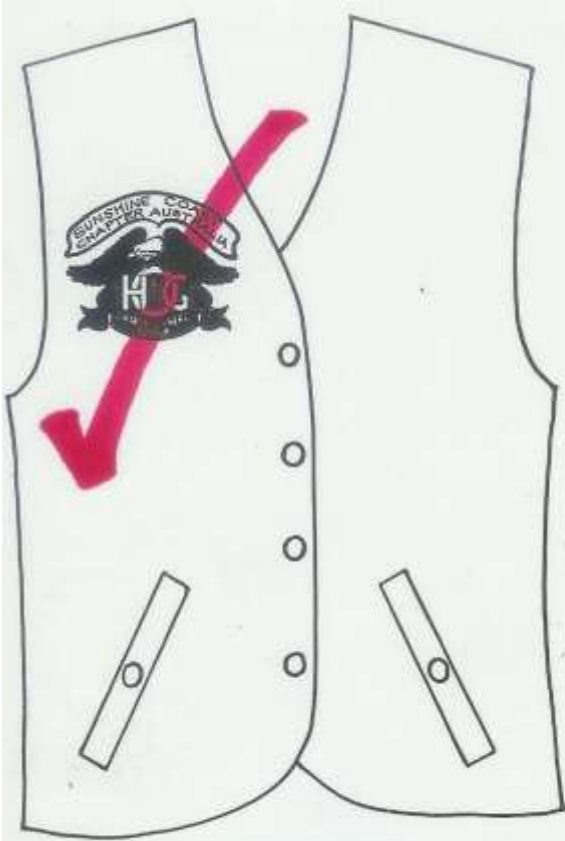
Clothing

Standard of dress for members is left to the individual.

The Chapter does however have a *Chapter shirt* in Chapter colours of Yellow and Black adorned with the H.O.G. and our Chapter logos. It is available in Mens and Ladies fit and in dress shirt and polo styles. Most members prefer to wear this on Chapter rides and to meetings.

In respect to those organisations whose members earn their Patches rather than purchase them, the H.O.G. or any other club Logo (Patch) is not to be worn on the rear of clothing. Neither these nor 1% Logos are to be worn by Sunshine Coast Chapter H.O.G. Members or attendees at our rides or events.

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Rides – Finer Detail

The **Main Ride** is held on the third Sunday of each month, meeting at 7.45am at KFC Sippy Downs, Cnr Sippy Downs Drive & Dixon Road, Sippy Downs. Coffee and breakfast is available for that early morning “fire up” from 7.00am.

Individual members (called a “Ride Captain” on the day of the ride) set these rides. The Ride Captain volunteers to set a ride, under the guidance of the Head Road Captain. These Rides can take weeks to organise and give a lot of satisfaction to the Ride Captain and a great day's riding and socialising for members. The Rides include a variety of roads travelled, sights seen and a great lunch stop. A \$2 ride register fee per person goes toward offsetting Chapter costs plus \$1 per bike as a fuel levy for the backup vehicle.

Other **Day Rides** include poker runs, picnics, breakfasts, dinners etc. They are organised with the rider in mind and provide a great day of riding and fellowship. Trophies, lucky prizes and the like are often a part of the benefits.

Weekend Trips (and longer) for H.O.G. Members, as well as group attendance at various other rallies and functions are pre-planned including accommodation and fuel/rest stops along the way as well as occasionally pre-arranged meal venues.

Social - Finer detail

The Ladies of Harley Morning Tea is on the first Saturday monthly commencing around 9am at varying locations. Contact the Ladies of Harley officer, Jodie, on 0412 324 890 for more details.

Males are welcomed at this social morning.

The Dealership Brekky Sausage Sizzle is on the last Saturday of each month from 9am at Sunshine Coast Harley-Davidson, 490 Maroochydore Road, Kunda Park. Members and public are welcome.

The Christmas Party is usually organised by one or two volunteer members. One regular feature is a voluntary "Gift Tree" where members may choose to leave wrapped presents to be given to underprivileged children via a local charity.

Shopping Trips/Movie Nights/River Cruises are popular and give a great opportunity for socialising.

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III MEMBERSHIP

Joining Procedure -

1. H.O.G. (International) Membership is a pre-requisite

Join online as a General, Associate or Life member at www.hog.com or telephone the H.O.G. office on 1800 464 258 – free call.

(If you have purchased a new Harley-Davidson - your first year of Membership for H.O.G. International is free and processed automatically).

Members receive H.O.G. Items:

Membership Card, Emblem (Patch), Pin, subscription to the excellent colour magazine "HOG", access to the many H.O.G. programs (e.g. The ABCs of Touring mileage awards, Fly & Ride hiring, etc), and the right to join a local Chapter (e.g., Sunshine Coast H.O.G.!!)

2. HOG International Associate Membership is a pre-requisite

A relative or friend – male or female may be included when joining H.O.G. International - as an Associate Member. The annual cost is ½ the Full Membership fee, and Members receive Membership Card, Emblem (Patch), Pin and access to H.O.G. programmes and the right to join a local Chapter (e.g., Sunshine Coast H.O.G.!!)

3. Sunshine Coast Chapter of H.O.G.

As a benefit of being a H.O.G.® (International) member, (Full, Associate or Life) a H.O.G.® member may join any Chapter. An expired membership in H.O.G.® automatically terminates local Chapter membership.

After completion of two Chapter Rides & one Meeting Attendance the Application Form with supporting documentation may be:

- a) mailed to Membership Officer Sunshine Coast HOG PO Box 6002 Maroochydore BC 4558; Or
 - b) handed to the Membership Officer personally; or
 - c) Handed to reception at Sunshine Coast Harley Davidson.
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5. Ladies of Harley (LOH)

On joining H.O.G. International, as either a Full or Associate Member, ladies may also elect to join Ladies of Harley. There is no extra charge for this and LOH members receive the Ladies of Harley Patch and Pin.

In addition, our Chapter has a "Ladies of Harley" Officer whose duties include welcoming ladies to the Chapter and arranging social events and outings for members with emphasis on the ladies.

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IV RIDING GUIDELINES

1. On Ride Day

A General

- Be on time (7:45 – 8:00 am)
- Have your bike fuelled up and ready to ride.
- From 8:00 to 8:15 am Safety Briefing and outline of the day.

On the ride:

- The ride is lead by the Ride Captain (different person every ride) who wears the red ride captain's arm band on their right arm.
- **Never** pass the Ride Captain
- Ride in staggered formation, not side by side. You must be able to see the rider's face, which is diagonally in front of you, in his/her rear view mirror. This helps to create a safe stopping distance between you and the riders directly in front of you and ensures that you are visible to them.
- If you find there is no one diagonally in front of you, when safe to do so, **wave the rider behind forward to fill the gap**. DO NOT move diagonally to fill the gap as this can create a "zigzag" effect through the pack.
- On a winding or narrow road ride single file only to ensure safe distance for braking and cornering.
- If you need assistance stay with your bike in clear view. Signal Tail End Charlie (TEC)/Back up vehicle to stop.
- If you're corner marking, stay in your place until the main TEC in the orange vest waves you on. The assistant TEC wears a green/yellow vest.
- If you like to ride at a slower pace and riders build up behind you and those in front of you are well ahead, when opportunity allows, indicate, move to the left and wave riders past.

Remember that you are riding with friends –

Do not ride in a way that may spoil the day for them or yourself:

If you like to ride "on the edge" there are plenty of other days to do this

STAGGERED FORMATION**

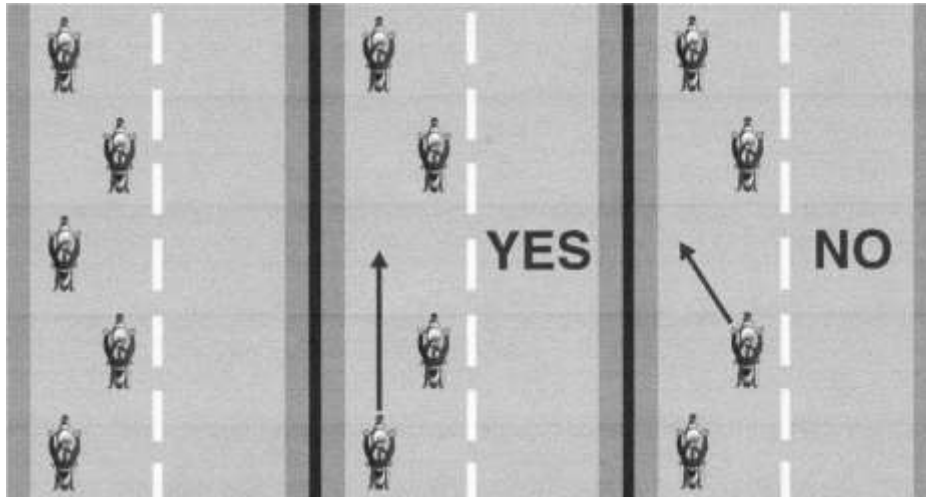

The gap between yourself and the rider in front of you should be enough that you can see their face in their wave the rider behind

E.g. rider 1 and rider 2. The riders behind you

E.g. rider 4

Rider 4 waits until rider 3 waves them forward. They then move up to fill the gap. Hold your position and mirror.

If there is a gap in front of you do not switch your position in the lane. great

forward to fill the gap. should follow suit.

As your speed increases so should the gap. You in 2 when the gap is in the destination. than when you are doing

The same method applies instructions and we will travel a lot further in seconds doing 100kph right hand side.

50kph. If it is wet/raining that gap should also be extended.

Do not switch your position from left to right or right to left in the lane. (see Fig 3)

If you are in any doubt about this please speak to the Head Road Captain or Safety Officer at any Chapter ride or meeting.

B **Corner Marking**

The reason for corner markers is to ensure the group stays on the ride route, and has plenty of warning of any deviation or clarification of the road being ridden.

Leaving the corner before being signalled to do so will cause riders to be lost.

Don't be the one to spoil the day for others.

- The next corner marker will be the rider following the Ride Captain.
- This rider will leave twice the normal ride spacing between him/her and the Ride Captain to allow for safe stopping at the indicated position.
- The rider second back from Ride Captain will also leave twice the normal spacing.
- The rider behind Ride Captain to be alert for Ride Captain's signal and to stop where indicated.
- Once a corner marker has been placed, the next rider behind the Ride Captain should, in need, move to the left to take station ready for the next corner
- The corner marking position selected must be easily accessible, safe from other traffic, and easily seen well before deviation is required.
- Once the corner marker is safely positioned they will indicate the direction of the ride by pointing, and using the appropriate turn signal.
- The corner marker will not usually remove helmet or other riding gear. He/she must be ready to move on immediately signalled to do so by the TEC in the orange vest. The TECs will not stop. **Do Not** move on until told to by the TEC in the orange vest. (except as below).
- In the case of a major delay, the TEC in the green/yellow vest will stop and inform of delay and advise corner markers to move on.
- Corner Markers will then join at the rear of the main group.

**Riders who are new to the Chapter
should start each section of the ride
towards the back of the pack
to avoid being corner markers.**

PROCEDURE FOR RIDERS IMMEDIATELY BEHIND THE RIDE CAPTAIN

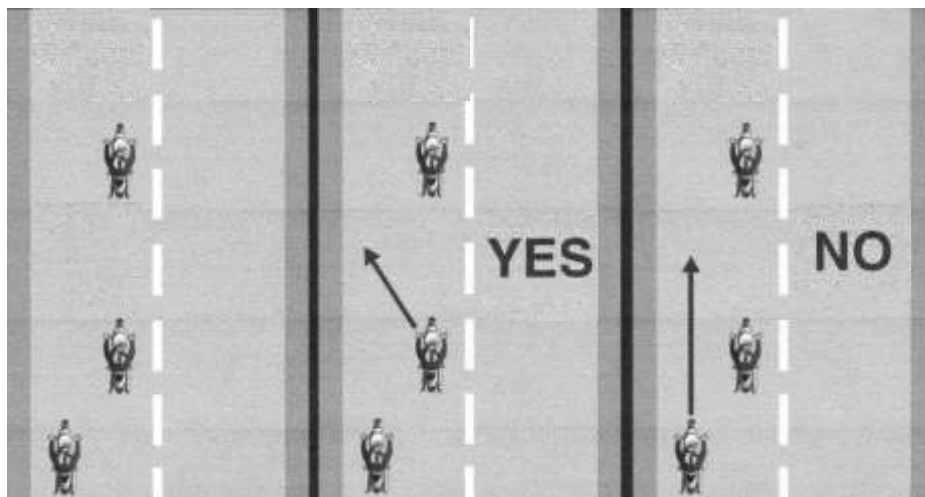

Shows the Ride Captain followed by the next two riders in the group.

In this instance the rider who was behind and to the left of the Ride Captain has already been dropped off as a corner marker.

The first rider immediately behind the Ride Captain now moves forward and to the left in preparation for when the Ride Captain indicates the next corner position to be marked.

The second rider **SHOULD NOT** move forward into the space left by the previous corner marker but instead maintain their place in the group.

If you are in any doubt about this please speak to the Head Road Captain or Safety Officer at any Chapter ride or meeting.
